 - Implement literacy and numeracy strategies in the classroom.
 - Use data and current educational research to inform practice.
 - Follow an agreed College Instructional Model.
 - Employ a range of assessment techniques for, as and of learning.
 - Integrate Technology into learning and teaching practices where most effective.
 - Incorporate classroom strategies that promote higher order thinking and creativity.
 - Provide opportunities for student feedback about teaching and learning.
 - Engage in a range of professional learning activities on a regular basis.
 - Build capacity of colleagues through coaching.
