College Principal's Report

"Better than normal"

A staff member commented in a meeting yesterday afternoon that he hoped that next year would prove to be 'better than normal.' It was a great comment because over the past 18 months we have often found ourselves thinking and saying that we are looking to get back to *normal life* or a *new COVID-19-normal*. However, I am sure that in any given year we would not be settling for normal, par for the course or the status quo. Instead, we would absolutely be aspiring to ensure that the coming weeks and months are as good as they can possibly be for our whole school community. There are a number of things going on here at the College which give me confidence that this is a realistic prospect as we move towards 2022:

During the week I have been able to welcome a large number of new families into the School Community at our Year 7 Transition sessions via Zoom. We can see the excitement and anticipation on their faces as their young people prepare to take the big step into life at Secondary School. It will be great to welcome all our Year 7 students for 2022 at our upcoming Orientation Day. Our Year 9 students are also preparing for a significant transition as they move into Year 10 and life at Senior Campus.

Next week Year 9 students will engage with a range of learning activities as part of City School. (Monday 29 - Tuesday 30 November: 9A, 9G, 9H, 9I / Wednesday 1 - Thursday 2 December: 9B, 9C, 9D, 9E, 9F) This is a great opportunity to get outside the four walls of the classroom and I am looking forward to hearing about the positive way that our students represented the College during this event.

Beyond next week our Year 8 students will attend Camp together and students across Year 8 and 9 will engage with Activities Week before the traditional picnic and final day at Funfields in Whittlesea. We are looking forward to celebrating the end of the school year at this point. Following this, normal scheduled classes will not be occurring, however, a program will be maintained here at school for students who attend up until 16 December when Semester Reports will be published to families.

Our Year 11 students have just returned from La Trobe University where they spent the day yesterday considering tertiary pathways and learning about University life. The feedback from teachers and students who attended the event, as well as from the team at La Trobe was very positive and we are very proud of the way that the students conducted themselves and engaged with the opportunities provided across the day. Well done! Our Year 11 students are now halfway through their Headstart program where they have commenced their 2022 classes. Next week they will be joined by our Year 10 students who will also undertake a week of their VCE program. We expect that they will continue to make the most of this opportunity as it sets them up for success as they move into next year.

Finally at Middle Years Campus today an initiative led by the SRC and Feminist Collective saw many of our students come dressed in pink and/or free dress. This was to raise funds and awareness around issue of 'period - poverty' and lack of access to sanitary items for women in our local, national and global community - the theme was 'Share the Dignity.' The day raised well over \$350. When added to funds raised by staff on this issue during Term 3 the total is close to \$1000 for the cause and importantly, it also helps to reduce any stigma associated with open discussion and action around this, and other issues associated with the health of women and girls. Well done everyone!

We are well and truly in a positive frame of mind as we move towards the end of November and I look forward to sharing more with you in the final edition of the college Newsletter near the end of the school year.



Guiding choices as the term draws closer to an end

It is not uncommon for students to feel as though some rules are optional as the end of a school year draws near. We appreciate the guidance that families offer at home and our remaining couple of weeks could be supported by conversations at home regarding the following:

- Encouraging students to express gratitude to classmates and teachers
- Reporting inappropriate behaviours in the yard to staff
- Continuing to wear uniform, wherever this is possible and having a note when it is not

In supporting student safety at school, please highlight at home that the following behaviours are not acceptable at school:

- Water fights/balloons- as other students often don't wish to be part of these activities, or expensive property (such as laptops) can be damaged.
- Vaping this is a health risk for students and the act at school can lead others to feel unsafe.

Any student involved in these activities will face consequences at school. Reinforcing this at home may help to reduce the likelihood of involvement and general feeling of safety around the campus.

It is important to us that students finish the year as positively as possible and good choices, with positive intentions play a big part in this.

Senior Campus Principal's Report

2021 classes at Senior Campus have now come to an end as we transition into 2022. Thanks to the hard work of our staff, we have now developed the timetable for 2022 and Year 11 students have moved up into their new Year 12 classes. This is a two-week program called 'Headstart' for Year 11 moving into Year 12 and a one-week program called Step Up for Year 10 moving into Year 11. This will give students and teachers the time to get to know each other, as well as set down the learning expectations for next year. Students will also begin their 2022 work, with the expectation that students complete some work over the Christmas break.

Year 10

Year 10 classes have now finished for the year and next week students will begin their Year 11 classes ready for 2022. This coming week Step Up will give current Year 10 students a good feel for what to expect in their Year 11 classes. VCE/VCAL/VET are all two-year courses, so it is important that students choose subjects in line with what they like, as well as what they need to achieve their end goal. The subjects they choose in Year 11 mostly remain the subjects they take in Year 12. This means that students need to plan their future pathway, making sure they are aware of prerequisite subjects for University or TAFE, or appropriate VET subjects for work placements. Attendance at Step Up is essential as students will also be given work to complete over the Christmas break, especially the reading of the English novel, No Sugar.

Year 10 Awards Assembly will be on Friday 3 December during Session 5, either outside the study centre if the weather is fine or in the school gym if it is wet.

Year 11

Year 11 students have now finished their Unit 1/2 classes after having a week of assessments

culminating in formal exams for both English and Maths. They have now begun their 2022 Year 12 classes and both staff and students are excited. As they now have their 2022 timetable, they have begun working on the Year 12 curriculum with their 2022 teachers. This will give them a good 'Headstart' into next year with the expectation that students will have some work to complete over the Christmas break. VCE English students should have read the play *Extinction* as well as the first novel, *Nine Days*, before they return to school. This week was broken up with an excursion to La Trobe University. Students were



taken on a tour of the campus, as well as attending presentations from some students completing their Masters and about Uni life. Year 11 Awards Assembly will be on Friday 3 December during session 3 & 4, either outside the study centre if the weather is fine or in the school gym if it is wet.

- have your own transport

- be able to talk to children's parents and teachers
- be available to work for 1.5 hours per day, generally between 8:00-9:00am and 3:00-4:00pm on weekdays during school terms
- able to obtain and retain a Working with Children Check Have had the 1st dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine and 2nd dose before 26 November, 2021
