Secondary School Attendance

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your teenager's education.

Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

School is better when your teenager is there

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Students develop good habits by going to school every day – habits that are necessary to succeed after school, whether in the workplace or in further study.

Missing school can have a big impact on students academically and socially. It can affect their test results, including VCE & VCAL, and, just as importantly, it can affect their relationships with other students, and lead to social isolation.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with falling behind in subject topics and assessment tasks, and lead to fewer subject choices and may impact on achievement in years 11 and 12 and post-school pathways.

Getting in early

It's never too late to improve attendance. Even in the middle years, when school can seem the most challenging for students and when attendance rates can be at their lowest, going to school more often can make a big difference. **Every day counts.**

Schools are there to help – if you're having attendance issues with your child, speak to your school about ways to address those issues.

In Victoria school is compulsory for children and young people aged 6 – 17 years

Student Absences

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

Family holidays – It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term. If you are planning to go on holiday during term time, make sure that you talk to your school in advance, and work with them to develop an absence learning plan.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your teenager have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission or skip out of school during the day. There can be many reasons for truancy; the best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

While all absences can effect academic performance, DET's statistics show that unexcused absences are a much stronger indicator of lower reading and maths achievement.

School refusal - School refusing children experience significant emotional distress not only when going to school but also at the thought of going to school; they may be absent from school for weeks or even months at a time. School refusal differs from truancy as children generally stay home with the knowledge of the parents and despite their best efforts to encourage their child to go to school. See: My child or teenager has anxiety



Being away from school for 1 day a fortnight equals missing 1.5 Years over 13 years of school

If your teenager is away

If for any reason your teenager must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Inform the school via your teen's Form/Home Room teacher or Year Level Coordinator
- Find out what work your teenager needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your teenager's teacher and ensure they complete the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your teenager must miss school, speak with your home room teacher or year level coordinator as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your teenager's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Chronic or ongoing attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice being issued to parent/s.

If you're having attendance issues with your teenager, please let the year level coordinator, wellbeing coordinator, principal or other relevant staff member know so you can work together to get your teen to school every day.

Top attendance tips for parents

- Schools want to work in partnership with parents – act early if you have any concerns by contacting your child's school and asking for advice and support
- Remember that every day counts
- There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes and their social connectedness
- Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day
- Open and prompt communication with your child's school about all absences is a good idea
- Avoid making routine medical and dental appointments during the school day or planning family holidays during the term
- Seek help from your school if you are concerned about your child's attendance and wellbeing. Schools want to work in partnership with parents to support student attendance and wellbeing.

MPSC Uniform Requirements 2022

MPSC is a compulsory uniform school. There is a standard uniform and a Physical Education (PE) sport uniform.

Standard uniform

- All students must wear only the school trousers/pants, shorts, dress or skirt, with MPSC logo.
- All students must wear the white MPSC shirt when wearing the school trousers/pants, shorts or skirt, with MPSC logo.
- All students must wear the woollen jumper or jacket or both, with school logo.
- All students must wear black leather school shoes as outlined on the uniform list.
- Only white socks can be worn with the summer dress, shorts, or PE shorts. Navy blue tights or white socks can be worn with the winter skirt. Any colour sock may be worn under long pants, including the PE/Sport track pants.
- Students may wear a white, short-sleeved garment such as a T-shirt under their school shirt for extra warmth.

PE/Sport uniform

- PE uniform is the PE polo, track pants or shorts, college jumper or jacket, each with the school logo. PE uniform can be worn to and from school on days in which a student has a PE class, including PE electives. Students may wear any sport shoe of their choice with their PE uniform.
- The PE uniform must be worn to and from sporting venues or at any other time when representing the school in sport.
- A mixture of PE and standard uniform cannot be worn at the same time.
- Hoodies and leggings are not to be worn at any time.
- Special Uniform Items – Year 12 students may purchase and wear the official Year 12 Class Jacket of their Graduating Year.

Recommended School Bag

All students are expected to carry a plain navy blue school bag/backpack as part of the school uniform. This should not have any logos/decals etc. printed on it.



Acceptable Shoes

All school shoes must be black leather lace-up or T-bar sandals and have a defined heel.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

What you need to know

Who is SSR?

State Schools' Relief is a not-for-profit organisation that works closely with all state government schools in Victoria. Each year, State Schools' Relief provides assistance to families experiencing financial disadvantage with school uniforms and footwear.

Introduction to Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

Through government funding the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) was established to provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports days and excursions. To find out more, or to apply for assistance, go to <https://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx>

State Schools' Relief provides packages to families eligible to receive this funding.

2022 Year 7 Uniform Package for CSEF recipients

Year 7 students for 2022 that are recipients of the Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) automatically qualify for the uniform package and/or vouchers.

What's in the package?

The 2022 package contains the following items:

1 x Polo Top or Shirt

1 x Trousers / Pants or Shorts or Summer Dress

1 x Pair of Shoes (Lace Ups or T-Bars or Sneakers)

Please note:

- PE items are not included as part of this package
- Shoes must be requested in UK sizes. The SSR shoe size conversion chart is available on our website [here](#).

Cost to families

Where State Schools' Relief cannot supply uniform items directly, you will receive a voucher that subsidises the cost of the uniform items. The voucher can be redeemed at your child's school uniform shop, or independent uniform retailer, which will be listed on the voucher.

Families receiving vouchers *may be required to make a co-contribution payment* towards the cost of the uniform items. The amount required to cover the gap will depend on the retail purchase price and the State Schools' Relief subsidy.

The voucher provided by State Schools' Relief lists each approved item, and the maximum purchase value, that State Schools' Relief will cover. Check your school's uniform price list to work out how much extra you may need to contribute towards the uniform item. **Please note** vouchers do have an expiry date and must be redeemed before the expiry date.

How do I apply for the CSEF Uniform Package?

Applications are made through your child's school. Please refrain from contacting State Schools' Relief directly as staff are unable to accept applications from parents/families or carers. Should you have any questions, or wish to apply for assistance, please speak with your child's 2022 school.



How do I receive the uniform package?

- All items and/or vouchers provided by SSR will be delivered directly to your child's school. The school will then contact you to arrange handover of these items and/or vouchers.
- The voucher will advise whether you collect items from the school uniform shop or a retailer. If it's a retailer, please check with your school to find out the nearest store.
- If a uniform item costs more than the maximum subsidised amount, State Schools' Relief is unable to cover any further cost.
- If a uniform item costs less than the maximum subsidised amount, the difference cannot be redeemed or transferred to an alternate uniform item.

Please note vouchers are not transferable and cannot be exchanged for cash; they cannot be used to purchase extra items and only the uniform item listed can be purchased with the voucher. State Schools' Relief does not make cash payments to schools or parents.

Terms and Conditions

- Only Year 7 students for 2022 that qualify for CSEF are automatically entitled to a uniform pack.
- Each student is eligible for only one CSEF uniform pack.
- All vouchers have an expiry date, which is included on the voucher. Vouchers must be redeemed **within the time frame specified**.
- If uniform items cost less than the stated subsidised amount on the voucher, any unused subsidy cannot:
 - be transferred to a different uniform item
 - be used to purchase an extra item; or
 - provided as cash to the school or the parent.

What you need to do

Your child's school will be in contact with you to order the 2022 uniform package.

CSEF Eligibility

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1: Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, **OR**;
 - on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, **OR**
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (27th January 2022) or term two (19th April 2022).

Payment Amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

Note: all sections must be completed by parent/legal guardian

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section. Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2022 closes on 25th June 2022.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.





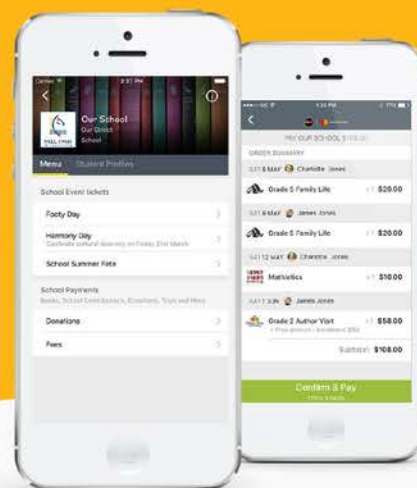

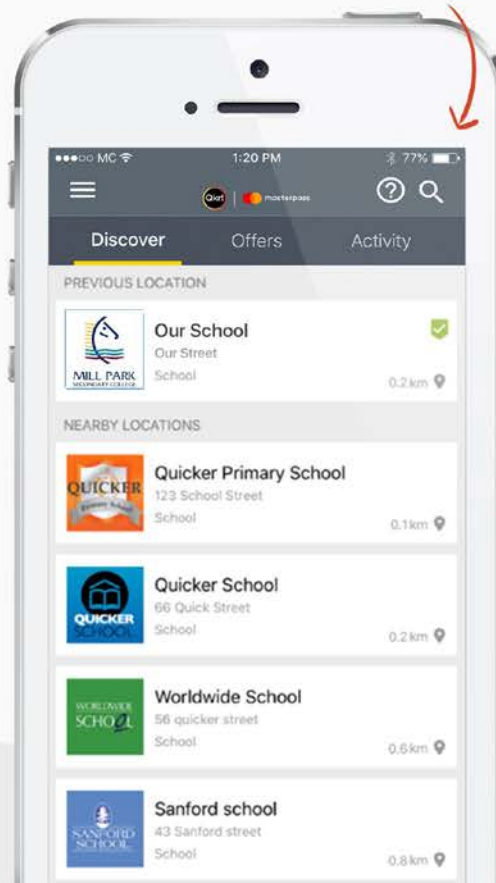

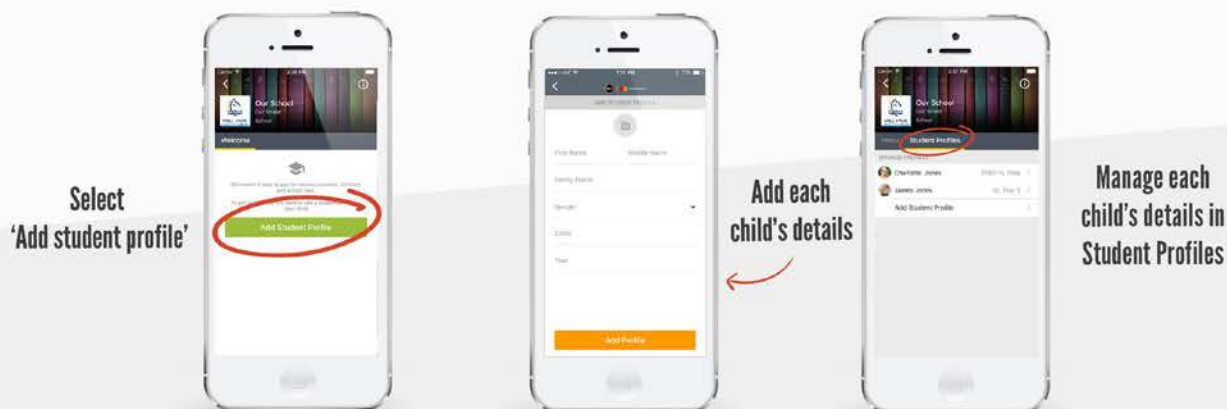

Please Note:

The MPSC wireless network only operates on the 802.11n 5GHz standard. Devices with 802.11a/b/g or 802.11n 2.4GHz only will not be able to connect.



Student responsibilities for devices and safe usage

All students are expected to bring a charged laptop to school every day.

All students and families are required to read MPSC Network and Internet Acceptable Use Policy which can be found in this pack or on the school website [here](#)

Do I need to go and buy a brand-new device?

Existing laptops may be used if they meet the minimum specifications.

Where will laptops be stored during breaks?

All 7-12 students are provided with a locker. It is their responsibility to purchase a lock and ensure that it remains locked.

Are there any additional items to purchase?

MPSC encourages students to protect their device by storing in a dedicated laptop bag or pouch.

Can students put their own software, music, apps or games etc. on their laptop?

Yes, the laptop belongs to you and you have full administrative control. However, if you have software or files on the device that breach the Acceptable User Agreement then we may restrict your internet access at school.

Is there any insurance?

Insurance is not compulsory and not provided by MPSC. It may be possible to include the laptop within your current Home Insurance policy.

Can students charge their laptops at school?

As there are limited spaces for charging, students are expected to bring a fully charged laptop to school to ensure maximum use in the classroom.

Will MPSC monitor internet usage at school?

DET provide a safe and secure Wi-Fi network. Some meta data may be recorded in this process.

Can MPSC monitor laptops whilst at home?

No, we are unable to monitor usage of devices outside of the eduSTAR network.

Will MPSC install any software?

MPSC will need to install the Wireless certificate to allow access to the network and the Citrix Client to allow access to the software.

Is the school assisting with devices repairs?

MPSC's involvement is limited to assisting students to access the network & software provided. We are unable to support students with repairs. A limited number of laptops are available to students, during the school day and for short periods of time when they are unable to access their own device due to damage.

I am concerned about cyber bullying, safety and over usage

MPSC is mindful of that students need to become safe and socially responsible digital citizens. It has a range of supports for students to develop safe positive habits in their use of technology.

- It's useful having designated times by when devices must be turned off.

Google Classroom - Guardian Email

Summaries

All parents and carers can receive an automatic email summary from Google Classroom for each of their students. You can choose the frequency of the emails - daily or weekly.

Guardian email summaries include information about:

- Class activity —Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers
- Missing work —Work that is overdue at the time the email was sent
- Upcoming work —Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or work that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)

In many ways, a guardian email summary works as a personalised email mailing list - inviting you to subscribe then sending regular emails.

A sample guardian email summary is shown on the next page.

How do I sign up?

As long as the email address that MPSC have stored in Sentral is correct, you can just sit back and wait. In 2021, invitations will be sent out In the first couple of weeks of term in 2021, you should receive an email from Google Classroom inviting you to receive a Guardian Email Summary. Once you sign up, you will begin receiving emails from Google Classroom every week (or day if you prefer).

Do I need a Google Account to receive email summaries?

No.

Guardians are not required to create a Google account to receive the email summaries - upon clicking "Accept" to the invitation email you will be sent weekly summaries.

But if you wish to change the frequency of emails (from weekly to daily) or view which students are connected with your account, you would need to create a Google account if you do not already have one. You can use any existing email address to sign-up for a Google account.

Who will receive Guardian Email Summaries?

Guardian email invitations will be sent to any/all parent email addresses stored on the system for current MPSC students (barring any restrictions). Students can have more than one guardian email address attached to their account if needed.

Should I download the Google Classroom app or login to the website?

No. Google Classroom does not offer direct login access to parents and guardians, so parents do not need to use the Google Classroom app or access the website. Instead, offering regular email updates should provide parents and guardians with an easy way of keeping in-touch with their student's learning.

How does this fit with other school communication?

Google Classroom emails are an additional communication channel that is brand new and designed as an additional way of helping partner with parents. Sentral is still our overarching student administration system, Google Classroom is more focused on the learning in individual classes from day to day.

Instructions for students:

1) First Time Logging into Google Classroom and Google Suite

1. Go to <http://classroom.google.com> and click "Sign in"
2. Enter your new Mill Park Email Address, following the format:
USERNAME@millparksc.vic.edu.au - replacing USERNAME with your login username for Mill Park Computers (eg.ABA0001)
3. Enter the password: millpark
4. Read and accept the terms and conditions
5. Set your new strong password (you might choose to use the same password you use to login to the computers - to avoid forgetting)
6. Choose that you are a "Student" (not a teacher)
7. You're in! You should now see "Classrooms" for each of your subjects for 2022.

Your Mill Park Google Account

The new Google Classroom account provides more than just access to Google Classroom, you get access to:

- Google Drive - with unlimited storage
- GMail for your school email account
- Google Calendar, which will automatically have the due dates for any work set in Google Classroom
- Google Docs, Sheets, Slides and many other useful Google tools

Can I use this on my phone?

Yes. but not in class. Downloading the Google Classroom app (on Google Play or the Apple App Store) is free, and it can allow you to be notified when teachers post work. You can also add your account on your phone to access student email, calendar and other Google services. But it is not possible to complete all tasks through the phone app, and you will not usually be permitted to use your phone to access Google Classroom in class.

Do I need to bring a laptop (or device) to school?

Yes. You will need a laptop or tablet that complies with the BYOD Minimum Device Specifications as found at <http://www.millparksc.vic.edu.au/byod/>. As BYOD has been available for a number of years at Mill Park Secondary College, it is now required that each student is bringing a device to access class materials.

How do my parents see Google Classroom?

Parents are not able to “log in” to Google Classroom, but instead they will be invited to receive regular email updates on the work assigned to you. New parents (or parents of new students) will receive an invitation to receive these email updates at the beginning of next year.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can't I just use my GMail account?

No. Google's “Terms of Use” don't allow schools to use personal accounts for school Google Classroom work. Also, in order to automatically enroll you in the correct classes, and to be able to ensure the authenticity of your work, we need to use your Mill Park account.

What if Classroom didn't ask me to sign in?

If you were taken straight to a blank Google Classroom page - you are probably already signed in with a personal GMail account. This is not a problem - just click on your user icon in the top right hand corner, and choose “Add Account”.

Sentral Education Portal

Mill Park Secondary College uses the Student Management software called 'Sentral' to manage all student data and communications. Students have access to their student portal on Sentral, where they can for example, access their timetable, daily announcements and reports.

Parents have access to the parent portal of Sentral. Parents need only one log-on despite how many children they have at the college.

Parents can access their child/ren's timetables, attendance data, school reports.

Parent/Teacher Interview appointments and daily announcements pertinent to their child/ren.

Once your child commences at the college, a letter will be sent to your home address providing you with the details of your initial parent access code (Family Key) that is required for you to create your account. When you create your account, you will be prompted to use your current email address and to set your confidential password. Please do not share this password with your child/ren. Please use the attached documents for instructions on how to register and create your account.

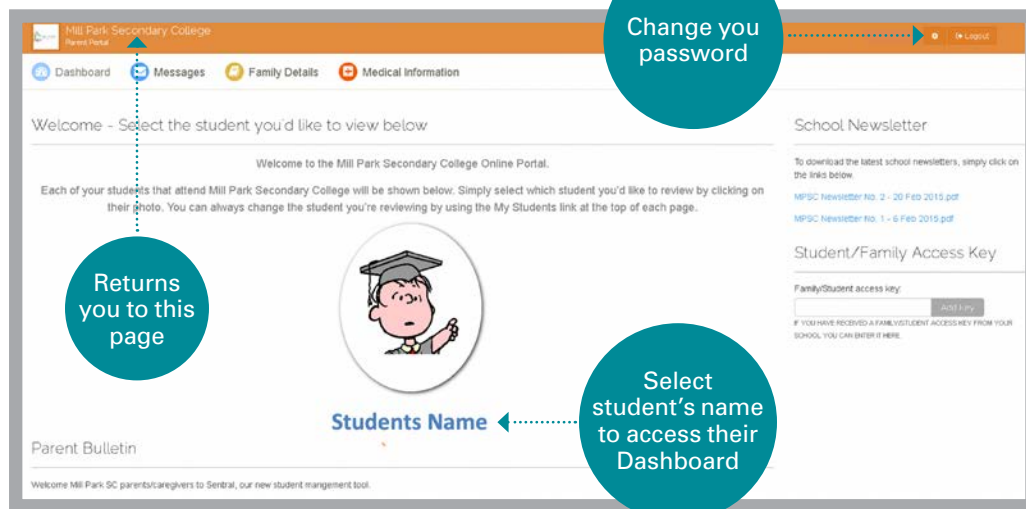

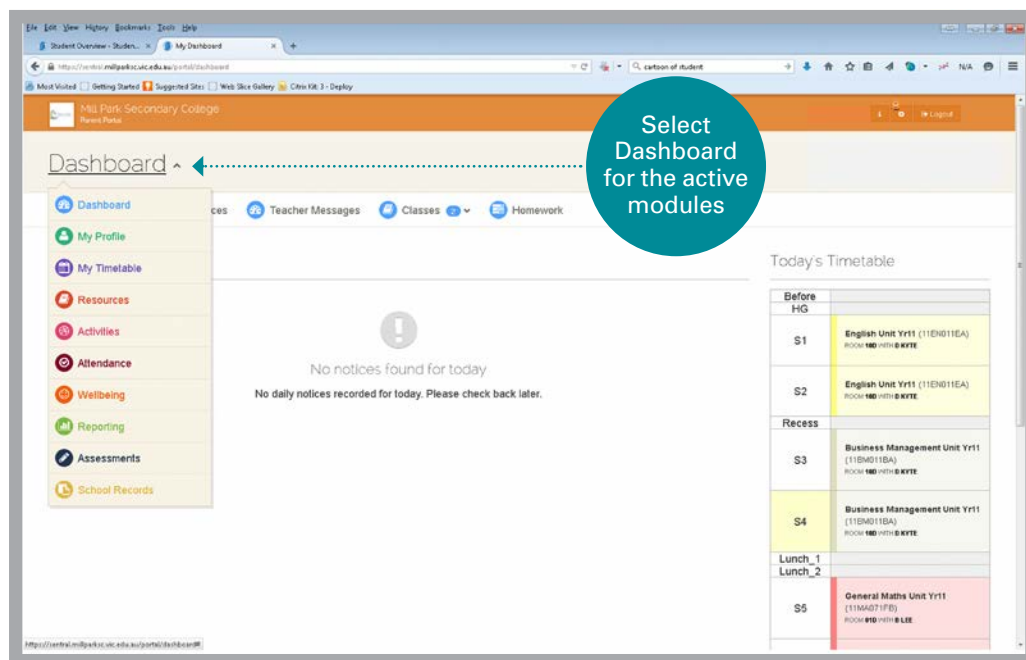

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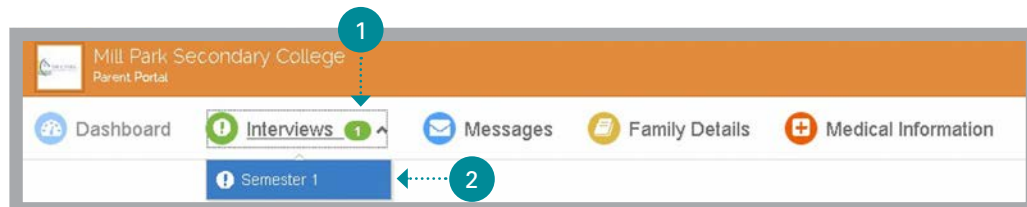

2022 Instrumental Music Program

The Instrumental Music Program at Mill Park Secondary College offers students the opportunity to develop a greater appreciation of music, musicianship, instrumental development and performance through specialist instrumental music lessons. The Instrumental Music Program also aims to foster enjoyment, positive self-esteem, growth mindset and creativity.

The instruments available include contemporary voice, guitar, electric bass, drum-kit, piano/keyboard, flute and saxophone at Year 7 - 12. Students also have the opportunity to participate in College ensembles and music performances.

2022 Instrumental Music Program Enrolment

All students who wish to participate in the program are required to complete the selections below and indicate their intentions for involvement in the Instrumental Music Program for 2022. This enrolment applies to both existing Instrumental Music students and new enrolments. Please note: Range of instruments and placement into lessons is based on staff availability.

Fees

The fees per instrument in 2022 will be \$105 per semester/ \$210 per year. Payment for the Instrumental Music Program must be made by 2nd March 2022, unless previous payment plan arrangements have been made. If paying per semester, 2nd semester payment must be made by 22nd June 2022.

Senior Campus Instrumental Music Program

It is highly recommended that students who have enrolled in Years 10-12 Music Performance subjects also enrol for instrumental lessons. This allows the extra benefit of a more individualised approach and will complement their studies in music. Depending on the context of subjects selected, some VCE students may benefit from having lessons for two instruments.

Lesson Timetables

Instrumental music lessons are held during school hours and students are withdrawn on a rotating basis from their other subject classes. Where possible, Year 12 students will be given lessons during their study sessions. Lessons for Years 7-10 students are normally in small groups while VCE students are offered individual/small group lessons to cater for the needs of the VCE curriculum. Instrumental teachers will communicate lesson information and timetables through Google Classroom and Sentral. Your child's placement will be confirmed at the start of 2022.
