College Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term 2 to all of our students and families, it is good to see everyone back at school and refreshed after the break. In the last few weeks we have also marked a number of important religious festivals including Eid and Orthodox Easter. If you celebrated these days I wish you all the very best, and hope that it gave you time to come together as a family and focus on what is important.

It has been a smooth start to the term, the students have been busy, not just in their classes but also in a number of activities such as Interschool Sport, and opportunities like the recent Outdoor Education Surf Camp at Torquay. It was great to hear some of the positive feedback which came back from this camp and I know that it has motivated discussions about future opportunities for students who missed out on many camps and excursions during COVID-19. Organising any event outside of school is not easy and I would like to publicly acknowledge all staff who have contributed to this and thank them on behalf of our students.

Positive COVID-19 cases are continuing to have an impact on both our students and staff, although we hope that changes to isolation rules for close household contacts will reduce this to an extent. Any student or staff member who contracts COVID-19 is absent from school for a minimum of five days - it is a major disruption to learning. With this in mind I encourage every student to continue to use the twice weekly rapid tests to identify positive cases as soon as we can, and assist in preventing wider transmission of the virus. If students are a household contact they are required to test 5 out of 7 days and to wear a mask while indoors.

While we are managing as a College, COVID-19 related absences, in combination with wider teacher shortages are currently placing significant pressure on our workforce. This means that there are classes who do not have a permanent teacher in some subjects, and in some cases such as Year 12 VCE classes, students are being sent home rather than having their class covered if a teacher is absent near the end of the school day. This is clearly not ideal and I would ask for your patience while we work through these issues which are currently being experienced by schools across the state. Rest assured we are doing everything we can to ensure continuity and stability in learning for our students. When classes can't be covered, parents will receive an email or text that day if we know students are being released at lunchtime.

One impact of staffing shortages is that for Term 2, 2022, the Department of Education and Training has provided schools with the option to hold each teacher's allocated Professional Practice Day on the same day for all staff. This is to enable the most effective and efficient use of this day. As a result, we have scheduled our Professional Practice Day for Tuesday 24 May. Students will therefore not be required to attend school on this day.

On Tuesday 17 May, the College will also be holding its School Council Annual General Meeting at 6:00pm. This is an open meeting and if there are any non-School Council members who wish to attend, please RSVP to Jo Armarego via email: joanne.armarego@education.vic.gov.au by Monday 16 May.

Finally, our College is about to embark on a 30 Day Challenge on the character strength of Positive

Relationships. Beginning on May 17, students will undertake a range of activities to reflect on their relationships and activate and inspire them to make them as strong and positive as can be. We know that strong, positive connections between students and their peers, as well as teachers are fundamental to good outcomes in both learning and wellbeing. Positive relationships are the 'glue' which keeps our school community connected and I look forward to seeing our focus on this over the coming weeks.



MY Campus Principal's Report

Good Holidays = A Good Start

At the end of Term one I urged students to ensure they made plans to fill their holidays with rest and enjoyment. I asked that when we returned and I posed the question, "How were your holidays?", I got lots of responses that were "great" (or better). Pleasingly this is much of what I have been hearing and I think this is reflected in the positive way students have settled back into the classroom routines and learning, so thanks for supporting/providing those holiday plans. To help keep the learning stamina up throughout the term keep encouraging a balance between work, play and rest. Adequate sleep is a crucial factor (particularly for adolescents), but often one they ignore. While parenting is more about picking your battles, than having to win every one, this is a battle that supports physical and mental wellbeing, social interaction and academic achievement. The best way to support quality sleep is a consistent routine that allows 9-10 hours of sleep. Let's keep rest up front as we combine work and play throughout the school week.

30-Day Challenge

The 30-Day challenge on relationships will take place from Tuesday 17/05 (Week 4) to 21/06/22 (Week 9)

The challenge will aim to improve your understanding of what makes a positive relationship, as well as acknowledge positive relationships in your life and at school.

There will be opportunities to nominate other members of the school community for behaviour that contributes to positive relationships, and a range of random prize draws to reward those who are nominated.

The Student Leaders from both campuses have been working on promotional videos and I thank Zach Melvaine and Savannah Jobson for their work. In Pastoral classes in the next few weeks there will be some explicit examination and teaching of what contributes to positive relationships and I encourage families to pick-up on and add to these discussions at home.

NAPLAN Testing

All Year 7 and 9 students will be participating in NAPLAN in Week 3 and the Monday of Week 4. The tests provide a n important snap-shot of student achievement. University Clinical Aptitude Test

The *University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)* is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their <u>medical, dental, and clinical</u> <u>science</u> degree programs. Universities requiring the UCAT are listed at this link - <u>Universities</u> <u>requiring the UCAT</u>. Students intending to apply for courses requiring the UCAT at any of these universities are reminded that they will need to **book a test**.

Bookings will open on 1 March 2022 and close 17 May 2022. The testing dates will be from 1 July 2022 to 12 August 2022.


