CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS


Song and Dance Concert

on 16th of October, English Language Centre students visited the Dingo Sanctuary and research Centre to deepen their understanding of Dingo conservation and their ecological importance.



Santa Moment 2025





ELC students graduation day
